

## WRITE-INS

### AT EVERY ELECTION, VOTERS CAN DO A WRITE-IN

No matter if it is a Primary or General Election, a voter can do a Write-In vote. At the bottom of every race on the ballot, there is a spot for a voter to write in a name. All the voter has to do is write in their candidate's name in the box and the machine will automatically scan it as a Write-In. You can instruct the voter that if they need more space to write in a name, WRITE UP THE COLUMN. The name has to remain in the column of the race they are writing in for.

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

- (1) Mark only with a writing instrument provided by the Board of Elections.
- (2) To vote for a candidate whose name is printed on this ballot fill in the oval O above or next to the name of the candidate, like: ●
- (3) To vote for a person whose name is not printed on this ballot write or stamp his or her name in the space labeled "Write-In" that appears
- (4) To vote yes or no on a proposal if any, that appears on the back of the ballot, fill in the oval O that corresponds to your vote.
- (5) Any other mark or writing, or any erasure made on this ballot outside the voting ovals or blank spaces provided for voting will void this ballot.
- (6) Do not overvote. If you select a greater number of candidates than there are vacancies to be filled, your ballot will be void for that public
