
HANDWRITTEN LIST

The Handwritten List is a list of voter's names as they vote, whether it be on the machine or by Affidavit Ballot. The Primary Election list is a little different than the General Election List. At the Primary Election, we need to know the voter's party. We provide you with a computer-generated form to keep the list of voter's names for Primary Elections. You will have a separate Handwritten List for each party in a Primary Election.





Just as with the Pollbook, we do not number the Handwritten List ahead. All voters are going to get a number EXCEPT AFFIDAVIT VOTERS AND BMD USERS, and the number should match the ballot stub. If a voter has to vote by Emergency Ballot, they will get a number, but you need to write an E, EM or EMER (whatever your preference is) for an Emergency Ballot. Remember to check the box on the ballot stub for Emergency. If a voter has concerns about the number on the Handwritten List corresponding with their ballot, please reassure them that only the stub is numbered, NOT the ballot itself. Once the ballot is cast, there is NO WAY to tie the voted ballot to the Handwritten List.

If someone comes into your polling place and asks for you to keep a copy of the Handwritten List for them, THEY MUST PROVIDE YOU WITH CARBON PAPER AND PAPER. DO NOT USE THE PAPER PROVIDED TO YOU BY THE ELECTION OFFICE. If they get there after the polls have opened and miss any names, you do not write them in for them, nor can they take the list, or stand by you to write them in. It is, however, permitted to take a picture of the list with a cell phone. You can flip through the pages for them to take pictures but ONLY if there are NO voters in line.
